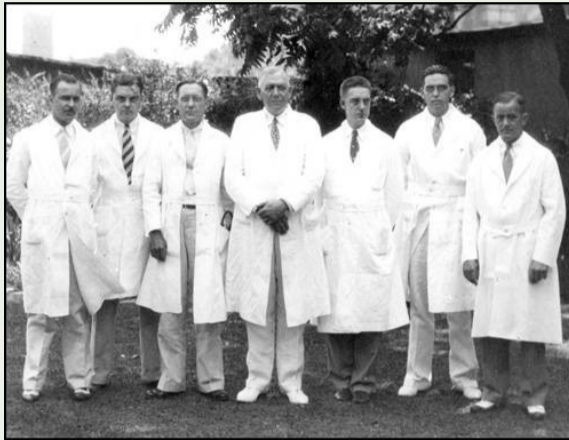

### From Campbell's History

Dr. Willis C. Campbell opened his practice in Memphis in 1909 and went on to achieve national and international recognition as a pioneer in many areas of the young field of orthopaedics.



One of Dr. Campbell's greatest accomplishments was the establishment of the nation's first orthopaedic residency program. He believed that specialized training was critical to the advancement of orthopaedics. In his presidential address at the annual AOA meeting in Memphis in 1931, Dr. Campbell said, "There should be an organized effort on our part to standardize the training of orthopaedic surgeons, which at present is entirely in the hands of the candidate himself. As is well known, there are no legal requirements regulating specialists in any field and many have entered the various specialties of medicine totally unprepared".

Beginning as a three-year program, the residency program now encompasses five years of study and training focusing on the development of surgical skills, research, and unsurpassed patient care. The program has trained over 450 physicians practicing in the United States, Canada, South America, and Europe.

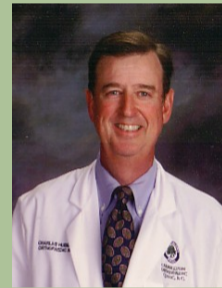
