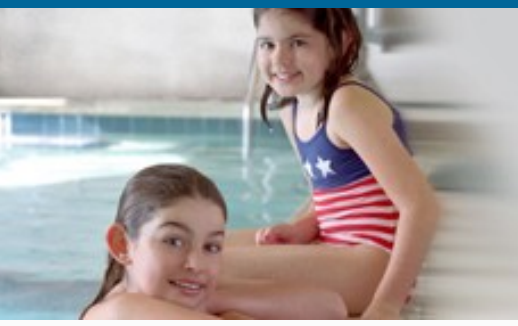

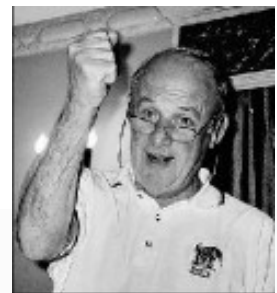
IN MEMORIUM

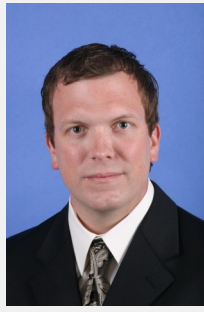

Campbell Clinic Welcomes New Staff

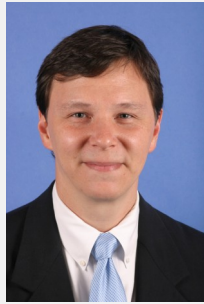
Joining the Campbell staff in August are 2008 resident graduates Dr. Matthew Rudloff and Dr. Patrick Toy.
