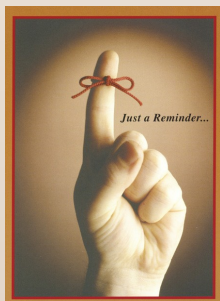
Dear Campbell Club Members,
