I am in private practice at Plano Orthopaedics Sports and Spine Medicine Center in a suburb of Dallas, Texas. I have been in practice for 13 years and currently serve as the Foot and Ankle Consultant for the Texas Rangers MLB team. I have also served as the Foot and Ankle Consultant and Team Physician for the Dallas Star of the NHL.

Since leaving the Campbell Clinic in 1998, where the latter part of my PGY5 year coincided with my Foot and Ankle Fellowship with Dr. Greer Richardson and Dr. Drew Murphy, I have continued to lecture, publish papers, and teach. I have recently lectured at the Major League Baseball Trainers Association Annual Meeting, an AAOS Review Course on Foot and Ankle Tumors and Imaging, a Stryker Course on Ankle and 1st MTP Injuries and currently serve on Arthrex Medical's faculty addressing various foot and ankle topics and product development. In 2010 I published an article in Foot & Ankle International on Peroneal Tendon Repairs and an article on Modified Brostrom Reconstruction in Surgical Techniques in Foot and Ankle. I have recently finished and article for Orthopedics Today on Peroneal Tendon Tear Treatment. Additionally, I am involved in a Sports Medicine Fellowship where I teach Foot and Ankle management in sports injuries. Current research includes Lis Franc Instability and Treatment, Aggressive Rehabilitation following Achilles Ruptures, aggressive rehabilitation following Modified Brostrom Ligament Reconstruction, Indications and Outcomes for 1st MTP arthroscopy, Secondary Achilles tendon repairs, Plantar Plate Repairs, and Revision 1st MTP Arthrodesis Following Failed Arthroplasty Using a Custom Cage.

Outside of the office, I enjoy spending time with my wife and three daughters, playing golf, hunting and fishing.

Hamilton, and Hugh Smith decided to perpetuate his commitment to advancing orthopaedic medicine and providing care to children and adults in the community. They founded The Campbell Foundation in 1946 to continue the mission through outreach and specialty clinics in the Mid-South area.

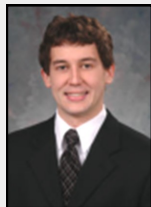
