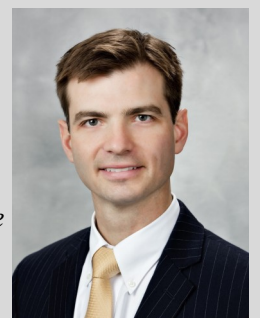

One or more Chief Residents are elected each year by their peers.
