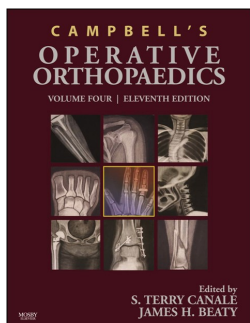

The Campbell Foundation has been selected as one of ten sites to participate in the American Orthopaedic Foot & Ankle Society's (AOFAS) National Orthopaedic Foot and Ankle Outcome Research Network (OFAR) Multicenter Pilot Project. This project will assess the feasibility of collecting outcomes data on a large scale for a number of foot and ankle surgical procedures. The study began in mid-March, and will feature data collection for approximately six months. Susan Ishikawa, M.D., is the principle investigator for the Campbell team.

The Campbell Foundation and Campbell Clinic staff participated in a symposium on Smoking Cessation, conducted by AAOS Now during the AAOS annual meeting. As preparation for the symposia, staff polled their patients on their willingness to participate in smoking cessation activities, in an effort to improve their clinical outcomes. The response from the patients surveyed was overwhelmingly positive to this sort of behavior modification. Further work by AAOS Now will be undertaken to develop guidelines for orthopaedic surgeons related to clinical and surgical management of patients who smoke.



Extensive work is underway now compiling the twelfth edition of *Campbell's Operative Orthopaedics*. Publication is scheduled for later this fall. The latest edition will feature *all new artwork* in 89 chapters, including several new chapters on Sports Injuries of the Foot & Ankle, Hip Arthroscopy and Hip Preserving Osteotomies in Young Adults.
